

English

Pupils will study various fables including The Lion and the Mouse. They will create character descriptions, discuss the feelings of the characters, take part in drama activities and imagine alternative endings for these tales.

Mathematics – Maths for life

Pupils will explore how number is used in everyday life including when using a microwave and when using devices to call people. Pupils will also further their understanding of money through buying items at manned and self-service checkouts.

World Studies – Foreign Cultures

Pupils will learn about the culture of South Africa through activities including using Google earth to find the country and some of its famous landmarks, trying typical foods and taking part in traditional call and response songs.

Computing

We will be using ICT devices to explore how people use them for pleasure, leisure and finding information. Pupils will use iPads to take photographs and find information before exploring how ICT is used in the community.

Independence Skills - cooking

Pupils will order instructions to make simple snacks and then they will follow their instructions to make their snack. They will evaluate their snacks and suggest how they could improve the snack the next time they make it.

P.S.H.E – Financial Awareness

Pupils will extend their ability to recognise and use coins. Through a range of practical activities pupils will use coins to 'buy' and 'sell' items as well as discuss other ways we can pay for items on the internet and in the community.
