Group B

Community Learning

This half term the group will continue to travel in the local area walking and using public transport. Students will be encouraged to visit local places and shops we have not been to yet, planning how to get there including timings. With the improving weather they will also be incorporating sport and games into some of their sessions.

English

Some pupils will complete their final Step up to English assessments including a paper on leisure. They will be tasked with discussing local leisure facilities, reading leaflets and answering questions based on what information these leaflets provide. Others will be looking at poems - how words rhyme, performing famous poems and producing a display based on popular poems.

Sport in the Community

This half term students will visit the John Willie Sams Centre in Dudley to use the Gym facilities there. Students will follow an exercise regime tailored to them with the help of staff from the centre. As part of the visit students also have the option to visit the cafe on site to purchase a snack or their lunch.

PSD

This half term students will continue with the module Environmental Awareness. As part of this students will get involved in an Environmental project that will improve their area. During our Life Skills sessions we will also learn to plan, prepare and cook a range of dishes.

Creative

Students will learn about Art and Crafts from around the world. Students will explore a range of media and techniques and create their own artwork. Students will learn clay casting and print making skills.

Maths

Some pupils will be completing their entry level certificate ELC assessments based on 4 of the 8 key areas areas: properties of number, the four operations, ratio and money. Others will work on functional numeracy with a focus on money and position and direction to link with community travel.

World Studies

Pupils will learn about and experience Asian cultures and lifestyles. They will research and study Hong Kong including the sights, sounds and smells. They will engage in Asian snacks and meals and work on 2D art styles of Willow Patterns and Ming.

Living Independently

Pupils will use their developing independent living skills to support enterprise projects across the half term. Pupils will research, plan, purchase and make items to sell in the weekly cafe to raise money for an end of year reward and to support a local charity.
