

English

Students will read a selection of English poetry from the literary heritage. Pupils will read poetry from Shakespeare, World War One, the romantic period and Canterbury tales. For each of these types of poetry pupils will also analyse and evaluate these pieces. On top of these studies of poetry, pupils will also have to re-enact a short part of one of Shakespeare's plays.

Mathematics

Pupils will begin this half term by learning about position and direction in relation to geometry. Pupils will then practice their money skills including finding fractions and percentages of totals to help when looking for discounts in stores and online. Pupils will also recap the topics of statistics and create their own bar and line charts by conducting their own research both at home and at school.

Science

This half-term, pupils will explore the world of scientists and inventors. They will learn about inventors in our local area and also nationally and around the world. Pupils will also come up with a scientific invention which they believe could help either themselves or a member of their class.

Computing

In computing this half term the class will all contribute towards a class radio station where we will use technology to record voices, instruments and songs to play on the class radio station using programmes such as garage band and apps like voice recorder.

Humanities- History

Students will learn the different forms that tourism can take and why tourism can be so important. We will also look at the growth of particular tourist places and what impact that has had on the environment.

RE

We will discuss the feeling of belonging, the purpose of belonging to something and how this makes people feel. We will also look at religious art, music and poetry to highlight their own purpose of religion.

PSHE
