

### English

This half-term we will be studying the pre-19<sup>th</sup> Century text, Moonfleet. Students will analyse aspects of the text and interpret the legend. They will extend their comprehension, writing, listening and speaking skills across the unit.

### Mathematics

This half term our focus in Maths will be upon:

- Place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Geometry
- Measurement, focusing on time and length

### Science

Students will extend their Biology skills this half-term through studying the digestive system and learning about respiration. They will develop an understanding of these processes and the body parts involved.

### Computing

Our focus this half-term is on Internet Safety. Students will explore how to keep themselves safe when using digital devices and exploring the internet, finding out ways to keep safe and what to do if they have any worries.

### Humanities

The class will be transported back in time to the Medieval Age, finding out about “Medieval Muck and Misery” such as the Black Death, revolts and what life was like for those living during this era.

### P.S.H.E

Students will cover a topic on emotional well-being. They will find out about mental health and ways to keep themselves well. They will learn strategies to help manage change.

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### Religious Education.

Students will become RE explorers, finding out about how religion can be defined and what this means around the world. We will explore the main question “Can we define religion?”

### Physical Education

The class will cover work based around Gymnastics, exploring movement, balance and flexibility. They will learn individual moves as well as creating short sequences.

### Creative

Students will go “Into the Jungle” for art work this half-term. The focus will be on developing their basic art skills of observational drawing, exploring shade and tone, mixing colours and using paint.

### Social Communication

To complement our work in PSHE, we will complete activities based on “The Worry Tree” where students can share their worries and work together to find solutions and strategies to support.

### English

### Mathematics
