

English

Our English work will closely link to our history topic. We will explore Drama skills including improvisation, rehearsal, delivery and performance. They will explore themes of WW2 to create and perform a radio broadcast. We will also explore non-fiction texts focusing on WW2.

Mathematics

This half term we will explore:

- Number and place value
- Money
- Statistics

Science

We will develop our Biology knowledge this half-term, focusing on Disease. Students will learn about microorganisms including how they can be both helpful and harmful. They will learn about how to keep healthy and to protect ourselves against harmful microorganisms.

Computing

Students will learn about Algorithms this half-term. They will learn what algorithms are, explore computer systems and learn how to represent algorithms using flow charts.

Humanities- History WW2

The main focus will be how WW2 began; looking at Hitler's rise to power and the role of propaganda in the Nazi party. We will describe the sequence of events up to and following the Normandy invasion during WW2. We will then discuss and explain causes and effects of events in late WW2.

P.S.H.E

Students will complete work on friendships and bullying. We will explore how to develop positive friendships, to show respect to others and learn what to do if they witness or experience any bullying.

Religious Education.

Our work this half-term will focus on exploring different religious and non-religious world views. We will explore different world beliefs and ways of celebrating or observing these beliefs.

Physical Education

In PE lessons this half-term, students will explore short tennis. They will learn tennis skills, have the opportunity to practise and refine these, as well as playing some competitive games.

Creative- Food in Art

We will look at how food has been used as a topic in art and look at the work of famous artists, including those following Pop Art. Students will complete observational drawings and then make 3D models of a food item to create their own "food in art" piece.
